

## LAKE OF THE OZARKS SCOUT RESERVATION - SHORT TERM CAMPING RESOURCES

### CAMPSITES:

There are thirteen campsites at the Lake of the Ozarks Scout Reservation. There are fire pits, shelters and picnic tables in each site and latrines in most sites. There is water in the campsites, shower and laundry facilities nearby for use from April 15<sup>th</sup> through October 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Cost:** GRC Scouting Groups – No charge      Non Scouting Groups - \$5.00 person/night

### CANOES AND ROWBOATS:

Canoes and rowboats are available for use on property only. Canoes and rowboats include paddles/oars, and PFD's. All Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat requirements must be met.

**Cost:** Scouting Groups - \$5.00 each/day      Non Scouting Groups - \$15.00 each/day

### RIFLE:

Contact the Council office to schedule a shooting sports weekend and to get current pricing.

### OTHER CAMP EQUIPMENT:

Tents with floorboards (\$10.00 each), dining flies (\$10.00 each), cook kits (\$5.00 each), utensil kits (\$5.00 each), griddles (\$5.00 each), and Dutch ovens (\$5.00 each) are available from the camp ranger with prior request. It will be the responsibility of the group to checkout and check-in these items from the Camp Ranger. If items are lost, damaged, or not turned back in, your group will be charged the full replacement cost for these items.

### STAFF CABINS:

Thirteen cabins are available for offseason use. Each has concrete floors and 2-4 bunk beds. There is no water, heat or air-conditioning in these cabins. Restroom and shower facilities are available nearby, adjacent to the Parkhurst Staff Lodge.

**Cost:** Scouting Groups - \$20.00/cabin/night      Non Scout Group - \$30.00/cabin/night

### VARIOUS SHELTERS:

Lake of the Ozarks Scout Reservations has several shelters that are available for rental by units and nonscout scout groups. Shelters that are available include Show-N-Do, Johnson and Fingland. (Show-N-Do, Fingland are not available October-April)

**Cost:** Scouting Groups-\$35.00      Non Scouting Groups-\$50.00 per day

### PARKHURST STAFF LODGE:

This newly renovated lodge has two spacious sleeping rooms, a kitchen with stoves and refrigerators, and a dining area. Tables and chairs are available. Adjacent to the lodge is a heated restroom & shower facility. The building is heated and has bunks for 16 people upstairs plus an additional 6 downstairs. Also available is a bedroom/bathroom in the basement.

**Cost:** Scout Groups -\$75.00/day (\$150.00/weekend)      Non-Scout Group - \$125.00/day (\$250.00/weekend)      Cleaning/damage deposit - \$100.00

\*For \$250, a scouting group may reserve both Parkhurst Lodge and all of the Staff Cabins for a weekend. (\$500 for nonscouting groups)

### CLIMBING AND RAPPELLING TOWER:

Is available for use year around (weather permitting) as long as a Climbing Instructor is present and approved by the Great Rivers Council C.O.P.E./Climbing committee. For a list of the qualified people within the Council, please contact the Council Service Center.

**Cost:** Scouting Groups - \$5.00/person      Other Youth Groups: \$10.00/person      Adult Groups: \$15.00/person

### PROJECT C.O.P.E. (CHALLENGING OUTDOOR PERSONAL EXPERIENCE)

Project C.O.P.E. is an exciting outdoor activity that can be used to attract and hold members in a group. It offers a set of stimulating activities designed to meet the needs of the people who are seeking greater challenges to their physical and mental abilities. Group activities are ideal for emphasizing teamwork and leadership skills. Individual activities promote personal growth. C.O.P.E. starts with initiative games, and continues with low and high course activities. Participants will climb, swing, balance, jump, rappel, and think of solutions to a variety of situations.

**Cost:** \$20.00 per person - Includes registration, COPE bandana, instructors, and the use of safety equipment.

(All participants must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. Food and C.O.P.E. T-shirts are not provided. All participants in C.O.P.E. must be 13 years old or older by January 1 of the year attending. Each participant must have a current health history and, if under 18, a consent form from a parent or guardian.)

**Non-Scouting Groups:** \$150 per person, food and lodging included. A Hold Harmless Agreement and certificate of insurance is required.
